HIGHLIGHTS: How can platforms support sexual privacy?

1. **Policy:** encourage consent around saving images, ban unsolicited sexts
2. **Community Moderation:** policy enforcement
3. **Interface design:** not allow photos to be sent unless both chat participants allow it

RESEARCH QUESTIONS

What are adults experiences, concerns, and mitigation strategies around sexting?

METHOD: Mixed-methods, anonymous survey ($N = 247$) study with adults who sext or have sexted

Investigating How People (Don't) Investigate Misinformation on Social Media

RESEARCH QUESTIONS & METHODS: This study explores how users react to fake news posts on their Facebook or Twitter feeds, as if posted by someone they follow. We conducted semi-structured interviews with 25 participants who use social media regularly for news, temporarily caused fake news to appear in their feeds with a browser extension unbeknownst to them, and observed as they walked us through their feeds. At the end, we debriefed them on the misinformation they had seen.
